We are gearing up for another fun and exciting summer with R.O.C.K. Camp in partnership with Camp Boggy Creek. The First Session took place on June 26-July 2nd for children from South Florida, including Miami, Ft. Lauderdale, West Palm Beach, Fort Myers and Tampa.
